### Bust your stash of recycled fabric

I couldn't resist making this simple block out of the recycled fabrics I have collected over the past several years! Try this block by matching one color to another color instead of always using a cream or white background. Play with colors you wouldn't normally find yourself putting together.

Using the "Triangle-Squares" technique on page 23, pair the A's to make 2 unit 1's.

Sew the strips together to make the band. Cut the band at 41/2" intervals to make 4 units 2's and at 11/2" intervals to make 8 unit 3's.

Join the patches and units as shown to complete the block.


