Bust your stash of recycled fabric

I couldn't resist making this simple block out of the recycled fabrics I have collected over the past several years! Try this block by matching one color to another color instead of always using a cream or white background. Play with colors you wouldn't normally find yourself putting together.

Using the "Triangle-Squares" technique on page 23, pair the A's to make 2 unit 1's.

Sew the strips together to make the band. Cut the band at $4\frac{1}{2}$ " intervals to make 4 unit 2's and at $1\frac{1}{2}$ " intervals to make 8 unit 3's.

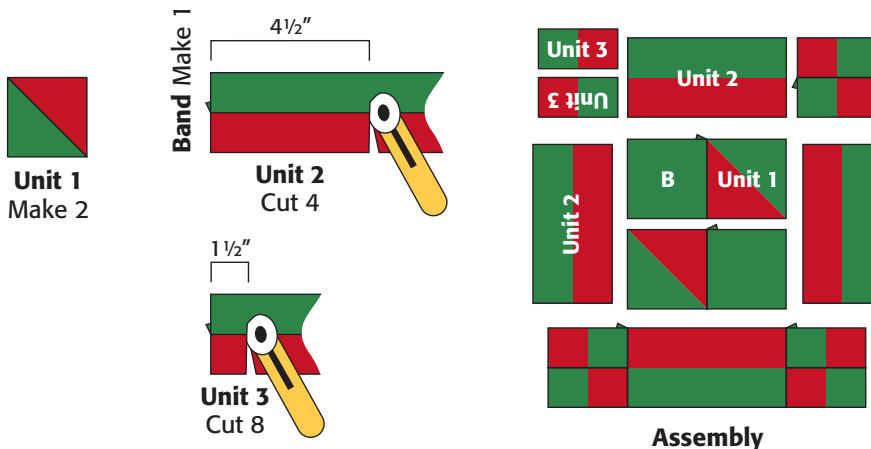
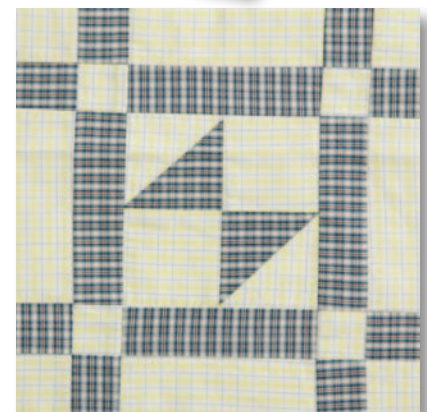
Join the patches and units as shown to complete the block.

Finished Block: 8"
For *one* block, cut the following:

- Print #1**
1 strip $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 32" for band
1 square (A) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " x $2\frac{7}{8}$ "
2 squares (B) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ "

- Print #2**
1 strip $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x 32" for band
1 square (A) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " x $2\frac{7}{8}$ "
