Twirl Around

Bust your stash!

Sewing quilts with "Stitch-and-Flip" corners always leaves me with more bonus triangles to put to good use in a future project down the road!

In this case, I had a whole bunch of 2" unfinished triangle-squares in pinks and lights, just perfect for these springy spinning Pinwheel blocks. The uses for leftover triangles are endless.

Set this quilt with sashings, either in a straight setting or on point, and a plain alternate block leaving lots of space for a beautiful quilting design.

Sew the patches together as shown to make the block.

cutting

Finished Block: 6"
For *one* block, cut the following:

Green Prints and Tone-on-Tones 4 squares (A) 2"x 2"

Light Prints and Tone-on-Tones


4 squares (A) 2"x 2"

8 squares 2¾" x 2¾" cut diagonally to yield 16 triangles
☐ (B) (use 8; save the rest for more blocks)

Pink Prints and Tone-on-Tones

8 squares 2¾" x 2¾" cut diagonally to yield 16 triangles
